## Volleyball court design data

## Court dimensions

$9 \mathrm{~m} \times 18 \mathrm{~m}$
Safety margins: 3 m clear width all round court

## Line markings

Width of lines: 50 mm
External dimensions include width of lines
Two side lines and two end lines mark the playing court. The axis of the centre line divides the playing court into two equal courts measuring $9 \mathrm{~m} \times 9 \mathrm{~m}$ each. This line extends beneath the net from side line to side line.

On each court, an attack line, where the rear edge is drawn 3 m back from the axis of the centre line, marks the front zone.

The service zone is a 9 m wide area behind each end line. It is limited by two short lines, each 15 cm long, drawn 20 cm behind the end line as an extension of the side lines.

## Colours

They must be of a light colour which is differs from the colour of the floor and from any other lines.
For international competitions the playing court and the free zone require to be different colours from each other. (colours unspecified)

## Playing surface

Sports floor conforming to BS EN 14904:2006

## Clear height requirements

National level competition: 7 m clear height over the court area and the whole of the safety margin International level competition: 12.5 m clear height over the court area and the whole of the safety margin

## Net

The net should be placed vertically over the centre line of the courts. The top of the net is set at the height of 2.43 m for men and 2.24 m for women. Its height is measured from the centre of the playing court. The measurement over each side lines must be identical and must not exceed the official height by more than 20 mm .


## Sport hall environment

Ideal temperature: 16 degrees
Recreational and club use: $10^{\circ} \mathrm{C}-25^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$
International events: $16^{\circ} \mathrm{C}-25^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$
Lighting levels:
Recreational and club use: 300-500lux
International events: 1000lux
All lux levels are measured at 1 m above the surface of the playing area.

## Posts and antenna

An antenna is a flexible rod, 1.80 m long and 10 mm in diameter, made of fibreglass or similar material.

The top 800 mm of each antenna extends above the net and is marked with 100 mm stripes of contrasting colour, preferably red and white.

The posts supporting the net are placed at a distance of $50 \mathrm{~mm}-1 \mathrm{~m}$ outside the side lines. They are 2.55 m high and preferably adjustable. For all world and FIVB official competitions, the posts supporting the net are placed at a distance of 1 m outside the side lines. The posts are fixed to the net and are rounded and smooth.
