Charges for sports facilities: Scotland 2014/15

This information digest:

- describes the approach to the review, undertaken annually since 1985;
- summarises the 2014/2015 charges;
- reports on the trends in sports facilities/activities charges over the period 2010 to 2014; and
- presents the results of a survey of concessionary and passport access schemes in Scotland.

Background

This annual research undertaken by **sport**scotland provides an overview of public sector charges for the use of indoor and outdoor sports facilities and swimming pools. It is based on a survey of the Scottish local authorities and their associated leisure trusts, covering over 70 different activities or facilities.

Changes in this year's report

After each of the last fourteen charges surveys, short user feedback surveys were undertaken to determine the need for and scope of any future developments. The feedback from these identified some areas for refinement, but indicated that the charges review largely satisfied existing requirements. This year there have been some changes to the concession charge section in order to collect more information around concession schemes.

This year's report is the second year to provide details of individual local authority area charges for membership schemes and this year also includes individual local authority charges for a number of other charges. This has been requested by local authorities as useful information when benchmarking. The main body of the report and the appendices retain a similar format to allow comparisons over time.

The 2014/2015 charges review

The data shows the cost of participation in indoor, outdoor and swimming activities as detailed in Appendices I-V. Charges show the minimum, maximum and average charge for each activity or facility, giving the full range of charges reported and the sample size of the number of local authorities or associated leisure trusts which operate a charge for a particular type of activity or facility. The maximum sample size possible in each area of activity is 32.

An average of the different prevailing rates within each local authority area has been used to represent its charges. This should ensure the validity of the overall arithmetic means generated, but may influence the recorded maximum or minimum for a particular charge category.

Benchmark charges

To simplify the tables and text, the calendar year in which the charges commence is used to identify that year. As a result, charges set for the financial year 1 April 2014 to 31 March 2015 are identified as 2014 figures.

Table 1 shows the charges in 2014 for the most popular sports activities and facilities in Scotland, covering adult, juvenile and senior citizen customers, with the corresponding 2013 charges provided for comparison.

Observations

Seven of the 19 charge categories in Table 1 show a percentage increase in arithmetic mean above the prevailing growth in the Retail Price Index (RPI) which was 2.3% over the same period. Of the remainder, four are below and seven show a decrease.

The largest increase in charges was recorded for swimming-related activities including charges for sauna, adult swimming sessions and juvenile swimming sessions. The average charge for sauna increased from £4.81 to £5.03, a majority of local authorities (19 out of 27) increased the charge with three areas increasing by more than 5% since last year.

The charge for adult swimming saw the largest increase of 4.2%, with ten local authorities increasing the charges by more than 5%. Overall 22 local authorities increased the charge and the nine remaining kept the 2013/14 rate.

Corresponding juvenile swimming sessions also saw one of the largest increases across all of the activities, increasing by 3.8%. For juvenile swimming sessions 22 increased the charge and eight remained unchanged, of those that increased, three increased by more than 10%. However the actual average charge for adult and juvenile swimming increased by 15p and 8p respectively in the last year.

The biggest decreases were seen in charges for juvenile activities; table tennis, golf and indoor five-a-side football. Golf charges for juveniles decreased by 7% and charges for senior citizens also decreased by 3.5%. Of the local authorities that offer golf activity, seven increased the charge for juvenile golf, six maintained at current levels and three decreased their charges. The decreases were deliberate strategies to stimulate demand.

Table tennis charges also decreased by 7% for juveniles, with 16 local authorities increasing their charges, eight remaining the same and four decreasing. Charges were reduced in some areas to stimulate demand.

In the last few years membership schemes have become more prevalent for public facilities and activities. Table 2 shows the range of charges for these schemes along with the change in average charge for individuals. This is split by type of access for both annual memberships and direct debit monthly payment schemes across local authority areas. More detailed information is available in Appendix IV.

Table 2 shows that the average cost of membership for schemes that offer the widest range of access increased for annual membership from 2013/14. Direct debit charges for the widest range of access increased slightly overall, with a majority of local authorities (13 out of 22) not changing their annual membership direct debit charges in the last year. For annual fees the biggest increases are seen in the charge for the widest range of access. The reduction for gym, swim and health suite should be treated with caution as the 2014 figures are based on figures from only one local authority.

It should be noted there are variations in charges due to a number of factors with some local authority areas adopting a strategy to set the charge for membership schemes at the lower end of the scale to encourage people to sign up. It is not possible to make any robust conclusions at this time about pricing across all of these schemes and the affect on usage, but it is important to acknowledge that membership schemes have become more important to local authority facilities as they offer a guaranteed income and this is likely to continue in future years.

Trends in sports facilities charges: Scotland 2010 to 2014

This section presents a summary of the movement in charges between 2010 and 2014 for a selected sample of the ten most popular sporting activities and facilities in Scotland. Charges are outlined for various categories of customer and reference is made to the corresponding change in the Retail Price Index.

Four tables are detailed in the following pages, showing actual charges (Table 3) as well as year on year variations with respect to absolute and percentage price changes (Tables 4 and 5), and price changes adjusted for inflation (Table 6). The RPI percentage increase quoted is the figure to September in the year concerned, reflecting the mid point of each charging period.

An analysis of the information contained in Tables 3 to 6 reveal that, since 2010, the average change for the 19 activities and facilities sampled have not risen above the rate of the corresponding growth in RPI. However, over the last year eight of the 19 activities and facilities sampled have risen at a faster rate than the corresponding growth in RPI. Overall in the last year charges for these 19 specific activities and facilities increased on average by 0.4%, below the corresponding increase in RPI of 2.3%.

Over this time, juvenile badminton saw the lowest price increase at 1.6% followed by adult badminton, adult squash and a round of golf for adults, all increasing by 1.9%. The highest increases are for swimming-related activities, sauna, swimming sessions and swimming lessons.

It should be noted however, that most charges started at a fairly modest base level and that rises in RPI have remained relatively low, decreasing in the last year. The average annual increase in RPI over the last 4 years is just 3.4%.

This means that large percentage increases in charges can equate to fairly insignificant rises in the cash price of participation for the activities and facilities sampled. For example, the percentage price increase for a juvenile swimming session between 2010 and 2014 was 19.5%, the joint highest in that time period. In cash terms this equates to a rise of £0.36 in total for the four years or an increase of £0.09 a year. If the effect of the upward movement (14%) in the RPI is taken into account, the average annual increase in real terms is a modest £0.02.

When team sports are involved and the cost of an activity can be shared amongst several participants, price increases per individual are even less significant. For example, the 2010 to 2014 price increase for adult indoor five-a-side football was 12.8%, equivalent to £4.37. On the assumption that ten juveniles are involved per game, the effective annual price rise for each individual is an average of £0.11 (11 pence).

Although the general trend in prices since 2010 is upward, this is not the case for every activity and facility. Charges in fifteen of the activities and facilities have exhibited at least one year when charges either grew marginally by just under one percent or decreased. In the last year charges have decreased more than in other years – with a total of seven out of the 19 selected activities and facilities decreasing in price. This is due in part to strategic decisions to decrease the cost of some activities to stimulate demand or, in some areas, charges have been standardised across all local authority facilities.

If we take inflation into account we see that charges for fourteen of the activities and facilities have reduced in real terms since 2010 (Table 6). For some of these activities there has been a strategic decision by local authorities or leisure trusts to reduce the charge in order to stimulate demand, some are now free of charge or have had significant reductions in the last few years. This is particularly the case for golf, bowling and table tennis. Swimming activities including general swimming sessions and adult swimming lessons along with juvenile charges for badminton and squash are the ones that have increased above the prevailing rate of inflation and increased in real terms in the last four years.

Looking at changes on a year by year basis, adjusted for inflation, some activities and facilities have seen a consistent reduction in real terms. For example golf for adults and juveniles have decreased in real terms in three of the last four years. In comparison swimming activities have increased above the prevailing rate of inflation in most years.

In the past four years, charges for these selected sports facilities and activities have increased below the prevailing rate of inflation as measured by the Retail Price Index, increasing on average by 2.3% compared to an overall average increase in retail prices of 3.4%. Price increases have therefore been lower in comparison to increases in the general cost of living over the past four years and the charge for over 70% of these activities and facilities have decreased in real terms.

Concessionary charging and passport access schemes in Scotland

A questionnaire relating to concessionary charging schemes was introduced to the 1995 Charges Review and has been repeated each year since. This year, results are based on responses from 31 local authorities.

Information is collected on the three main types of scheme:

- concession charges;
- concession card scheme; and
- passport card scheme.

Concession charges

This scheme is directed at individuals from financially, or socially disadvantaged groups and involves the application of reduced charges for, or the free use of, various activities and facilities. Of the 31 responding local authority areas, 27 (87%) offer this type of scheme.

Concession card scheme

This scheme involves the provision of a concession card solely to individuals from financially, or socially disadvantaged groups, where use of the card affords access to a range activities and facilities for reduced or no charge. It is offered in 9 (29%) of the responding local authority areas.

Passport access scheme

This scheme makes concession cards, for which a charge is levied, available to general users. It is offered by 7 (23%) of the Charges Review respondents.

In addition to the above, three respondents (10%) operate a concession card scheme relative to a range of specific beneficiaries, such as elite athletes.

Table 6 details the different types of user groups that are eligible to use at least one of the three main categories of concessionary charging schemes available in the 31 responding local authority areas:

Concessionary charging schemes are made available in some form to customers from other local authority areas by 13 (42%) of the respondents. Of these, passport access schemes are the most accessible, with 43% open to non-residents. Concession charges schemes and Concession Cards are made available to non-residents by 44% and 11%, respectively, of the respondents operating such schemes.

The range of facilities offered under concessionary charging schemes is shown in Table 8, below:

Of the 17 respondents that operate the main card based concessions, 9 (53%) do not offer any associated benefits of scheme participation in addition to discounted or free admission. In the other 8 cases the most common benefit made available is for advanced bookings, offered by five local authorities.

Local authorities and leisure trusts also offer concessionary schemes for particular activities including free swimming. Thirteen out of 31 local authorities offer free swimming for school age children in the school holidays, and one offers free swimming for primary school children at designated pools in the school holidays.

Comparisons with 2013

The position with concessionary charges schemes have changed since that observed in 2013.

There seems to have been a reduction in the number of groups benefiting from concessionary schemes, apart from elite athletes where the number remains constant. There is a change across local authority areas where more reduced activities are now available at off peak times than at peak times. This is case for a number of groups including people with disabilities, those on income support, senior citizens, under 18s and students.

Future developments

The 2014 Charges Digest is the 28th edition in a series that has been subject to various developments over the years aimed at improving the quality and relevance of its content, as well as the clarity of its presentation. In the coming year, we will issue a short user survey to determine the need for and shape of future surveys.
